- **Crisis Intervention** – providing safety and shelter to individuals who are in crisis because of domestic or sexual violence
- **Services** – including a 24-hour crisis hotline, emergency shelter, counseling and support groups, transitional housing, and referrals to other appropriate community programs
- **Education** – for survivors, service providers, and the wider community with regard to the individual and societal dynamics of domestic and sexual violence
- **Advocacy** – accompanying and supporting individuals and their children as they access the resources available to survivors of domestic and sexual violence; working collaboratively to improve community-wide systems and

WHAT IS CAMP PEACEWORKS?

Originally developed by Safe Berks in Reading, PA, Camp Peaceworks is a week-long summer day camp that addresses social justice issues as the roots of violence in our society. The camp will follow the curriculum of "Making the Peace" by Paul Kivel.

The camp is open to youth, ages 13-17, who will be paired into small groups to help each other establish common ground across their differences and tackle these challenging issues.

Throughout the five days, we will cover a variety of topics involving social justice as it relates to age, race, sex and gender, sexual orientation, class and the intersections of these issues.

We explore ideas about how those of us with privilege and power can support those with less privilege and power by building alliances. Through alliances we can create a community where we listen, speak up, open doors for one another, take chances, and seek support from one another.

WHO WE ARE

Camp Peaceworks is facilitated by a team of trained staff members and volunteers from the Centre County Women's Resource Center (CCWRC) and partner organizations. CCWRC began in 1975 as a local grass roots effort. Since then it has grown into a multi-location organization that provides services to anyone who has experienced domestic or dating violence, sexual assault or stalking, and works towards eliminating violence in our community.

CAMPER EXPECTATIONS

- Campers should have an active interest in issues of social justice, community change, and specifically gender justice, racial justice, class justice, and other justice concerns.
- During camp, participants will be provided with the information and tools to brainstorm a social justice project in which they would like to participate post-camp in their schools or communities. By the end of the camp week, campers will be able to describe and name those projects.
- Further, campers will be asked to actively engage post-camp in an on-going school or community project that promotes peace. They will be provided with the ongoing support necessary to work to accomplish this goal.
- Campers will be encouraged to attend the camp reunion day and attend monthly alliance meetings throughout the school year.
